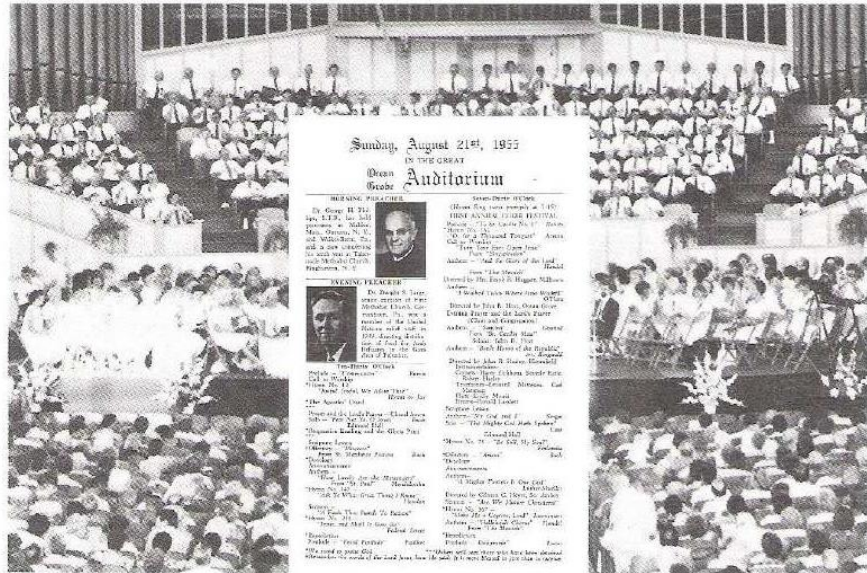

DIRECTORS



Cindy L. Bell is a fifth generation native of this famous Christian seaside resort, Ocean Grove, New Jersey. She is choral director at Sayville High School on Long Island, and the Sayville UMC. Miss Bell is a graduate of Lycoming College, PA and earned the Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting at the Eastman School of Music, Rochester NY, where she was a student of Donald Neuen. She has worked in advertising and sales for Shawnee Press, and acted as clinician for choral workshops. She has also sung under Gregg Smith, Robert Shaw and John Rutter.



Arthur W. Crouthamel, founder and musical director of the Abington Oratorio Choir, is also music director and organist at the Heidelberg United Church of Christ in Hatfield, PA. He has studied organ with the late Dr. Harry C. Banks at Girard College and Dr. Keith Chapman, head organist at Wanamaker's in Philadelphia. He received his master's degree in music conducting with Dr. Elaine Brown of The Singing City Choir. He has retired from public school education but is active in composition and conducting.



Alice D. Firgau holds degrees in music from Rutgers University (Douglass College) and the University of Michigan. She serves as choir director and organist at St. Mark's Church in Rahway, New Jersey. Miss Firgau has conducted numerous choral concerts, bringing together choirs of various area churches. She has composed anthems and hymn arrangements, many of which have been published. Miss Firgau also edits music textbooks for Silver, Burdett & Ginn publishers.



Ross Hastings, a native of Los Angeles, grew up in musical surroundings. His father was organist of the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra and Temple Baptist Church. After attending the University of Southern California, Mr. Hastings became choral conductor and orchestrator for the San Diego Symphony under Favian Sevitzyk and staff arranger for the Hollywood Bowl Pops. He moved to New York to take the position of Editor-in-Chief for Warner Brothers Publications and Bourne Co., music publishers. He now devotes full time to composition.



Dr. James Edward Hoy attended Temple University and the Philadelphia Musical Academy. He is presently the Organist- Choir Director of the famed Tindley Temple UMC. He is organizer and director of the Westminster Chorale Ensemble, founder of the annual "Messiah" festival at Tindley Temple, chairman of the organ department of the Settlement Music School and founder of the Philadelphia Association of Organists and Choirmasters. He has received the Distinguished Musician Award of the Philadelphia Pro Arts Society and the Religious Service Award from the Berean Presbyterian Church. Dr. Hoy served on the Hymnal Revision Committee of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church.



William R. Shoppell, Jr. is a graduate of Lebanon Valley College and received his master of arts degree from Columbia University with post graduate work at the University of Colorado and Trenton State College. He serves as chairman of the music department of the Freehold Regional High School District and Director of Music at the Point Pleasant Presbyterian Church. He also leads the 150 voice Monmouth Civic Chorus and has taken them on two European concert tours and recently a concert at Carnegie Hall. In the spring of 1988 Mr. Shoppell was invited to attend the First International Conference of Choral conductors at which 120 conductors from nine countries convened in Israel.



Alfred Swenarton is a product of the Salvation Army's music program. His life-long involvement in the music ministry of the Salvation Army includes performance, educational and administrative areas. He was horn soloist of the NY Staff Band and until retirement was Director of Music for the Salvation Army in the Garden State. He organized and directed the New Jersey Youth Band which received international acclaim. Bandmaster Swenarton recently was honored with the prestigious Blaisdell-Thorne Distinguished Citizen Award in recognition of his life-time dedication to music which has resulted in the enrichment of the lives of innumerable youths.



Clayton White earned undergraduate and graduate degrees in music and music education from the College of Music at Temple University. He completed post-graduate work at Temple and Westminster Choir College. He serves as Associate Professor of Music at Community College of Phila., Minister of Music of Zion Baptist Church in Philadelphia, Music Director and Conductor of his professional chorus, *The Clayton White Singers*, Chorus Master and Conductor for Opera Ebony and Opera North. Mr. White has performed in numerous recitals, concerts and operas. His credits also include recordings, radio and TV performances, and motion picture sound tracks.



Ralph Winters has enjoyed making music for the Lord for many years. As the result of teaching by several prominent musicians, he became a proficient vocalist and choral conductor. He is an evangelistic song leader and a director of conference choirs. Mr. Winters conducted the choir of the Epworth United Methodist Church in Paterson, New Jersey, for twelve years. He is a licensed local preacher of the United Methodist Church. Retired from the Bloomfield, New Jersey, Board of Education, he now serves as the Choir Director at the Faith Reformed Church in Midland Park, New Jersey.



Lewis A. Daniels is in his twenty-fourth year as Director of Music for the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association. He studied at Drexel University, Philadelphia Musical Academy, Philadelphia College of Bible, and Military Intelligence School. He served as Minister of Music at Twelfth United Presbyterian Church, Johnson Memorial Methodist Church, Frankford Memorial Methodist Church, Addisville (PA) Reformed Church, Community United Methodist Church and St. John's United Methodist Church in NJ. Mr. Daniels produces choir festivals and choral concerts, teaches and conducts the Ocean Grove Auditorium Choir and directs congregational singing.
