DIRECTORS



Arthur W. Crouthamel, founder and musical director of the Abington Oratorio Choir, is also music director and organist at the Heidelberg United Church of Christ in Hatfield, PA. He has studied organ with the late Dr. Harry C. Banks at Girard College and late Dr. Keith Chapman, former head organist at Wanamaker's in Philadelphia. He received his master's degree in music conducting with Dr. Elaine Brown of The Singing City Choir. He has retired from public school education but is active in composition and conducting.



Miss Elizabeth Dietz, in her fifth year as Director of the Teen Choral Dramatics and Youth Choir programs for the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association, completed her undergraduate and graduate studies in music at West Chester University. She has taught vocal and general music in the Boyertown area School District for 22 years where she directed many choruses and musicals. Miss Dietz also coached girls Lacrosse and is a member of the Student Assistance Program Team dealing with teen age problems. She has been selected for Who's Who Among American Teachers.



Dr. James Edward Hoy attended Temple University and the Philadelphia Musical Academy. He is presently the Organist-Choir Director of the famed Tindley Temple UMC. He is organizer and director of the Westminster Chorale Ensemble, founder of the annual "Messiah" festival at Tindley Temple, chairman of the organ department of the Settlement Music School and founder of the Philadelphia Association of Organists and Choirmasters. He has received the Distinguished Musician Award of the Philadelphia Pro Arts Society and the Religious Service Award from the Berean Presbyterian Church. Dr. Hoy served on the Hymnal Revision Committee of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church.



Lois White Norris is a native of the town of Sheridan in the Pennsylvania Dutch heartland where her father was a serving African Methodist Episcopal pastor. She began singing alto at the age of 2 years with the White family singers. Mrs. Norris earned her B.S. degree at Lebanon Valley College and pursued graduate studies at Temple University and Penn State University for her career as an educator. She is Director of Musical Ministry at Jones Tabernacle AME Church in Philadelphia and the Director of Music for the First District of the AME Church. She is a member of "Mirage", a musical drama club and the Founder and Director of the Philadelphia Ensemble, an internationally known ecumenical singing group.



Mary E. Prince, a native Philadelphian, has held positions in area churches, including Olivet Presbyterian, Melrose Park, PA, Olney Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia, PA, St. John's Episcopal Church, Merion, PA, and her present position of Organist/Choirmaster of Christ Church-Ithan in Villanova, PA. An employee of the Radnor Township School District in Wayne, PA., Ms. Prince has been involved in the Middle School music program, and recently conducted a faculty and student production of "My Fair Lady". Ms. Prince has studied with Lois Young Hunter, faculty member of Westminster Choir College, the late Robert Elmore and the late Alexander McCurdy.



Glenn L. Rodgers is a graduate of Westminster Choir College and Temple University, earning degrees in Church Music and Organ Performance. He has served churches in Philadelphia, Miami, and Wilmington as organist and choir director. He is currently director of music at the First United Methodist Church in Moorestown, NJ, leading a program which includes graded vocal choirs, handbells, organ recitals, orchestra and choir presentations, children's musical dramas, a two-week choir day-camp in the summer, and a community-sing of **Handel's Messiah**. Mr. Rodgers formed and directed a choir which performed in five European countries last summer and will go to Great Britain in July 1991.



Nancy Wertsch, a native of Wisconsin, studied piano at the University in Madison and voice at the famed Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, PA. After further studies in Germany, she came to Tennessee and then to New York City where she is an active performer and composer. Her compositions have been performed by the Gregg Smith singers, the Treble Sings and the Dale Warland Singers. She has received commissions from the Riverside Church, Meet the Composer, and Holy Trinity Lutheran Church whose Bach Orchestra premiered her organ concerto. Ms. Wertsch's music has been performed at the White House, the annual Martin Luther King Day celebration in Atlanta and in churches throughout the United States. Her arrangement of "Blessed Assurance" was a highlight of last year's Ocean Grove Choir Festival.



John L. Wilson is currently the full-time Director of Music and Organist at the Haddonfield United Methodist Church in New Jersey where he conducts ten choirs, including a 100 voice Oratorio Choir and professional orchestra. His degrees are from Westminster College, PA and the School of Sacred Music at Union Seminary in New York City where he studied conducting with Abraham Caplan and organ with Alec Wyton, receiving the Master of Sacred Music degree. Additional graduate study has been completed at Westminster Choir College in Princeton. Mr. Wilson also holds the Choirmaster and Associate certifications from the American Guild of Organists. He is frequent recitalist and workshop leader having performed at Longwood Gardens, St. Patrick's Cathedral, and the Cathedral of St. John the Divine



Lisa Blyler Wilson is the Associate Organist at the Haddonfield United Methodist Church in Haddonfield, NJ. She is a graduate of Westminster Choir College, Princeton, where she studied organ with Robert Carwithen and conducting with Joseph Flummerfelt. Ms. Wilson has performed at the Trenton Cathedral, Alice Tully Hall at Lincoln Center, and for the Philadelphia Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. She is a teacher of choral and keyboard music at Cherry Hill West High School where her chorus is so accomplished it is invited to tour annually. With her husband, John, Lisa is an active performer of four-hand keyboard music on piano, organ, and harpsichord.



Lewis A. Daniels is in his twenty-fifth year as Director of Music for the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association. He studied at Drexel University, Philadelphia Musical Academy, Philadelphia College of Bible, and Military Intelligence School. He served as Minister of Music at Twelfth United Presbyterian Church, Johnson Memorial Methodist Church, Frankford Memorial Methodist Church, Addisville (PA) Reformed Church, Community United Methodist Church and St. John's United Methodist Church in NJ. Mr. Daniels produces choir festivals and choral concerts, teaches and conducts the Ocean Grove Auditorium Choir and directs congregational singing.
