Directors



Clayton White is the Music Department Chair and the Director of Performing Arts at the Community College of Philadelphia. He serves the Mt. Carmel Baptist Church in Philadelphia as Organist-Director and is Music Director of the Clayton White Singers. Mr. White was chorus master of Opera Ebony and Opera North which staged productions in the Philadelphia Academy of Music. He earned undergraduate and graduate degrees in music and music education from Temple University and completed post graduate studies in voice and conducting at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey. He is an accomplished composer, choral arranger, vocal coach and accompanist with credits including recordings, radio, television and film.



Dr. Cindy Bell, an Ocean Grove native, is Assistant Professor of Music Education at the Aaron Copeland School of Music at Queens College, City University of New York. She earned the Doctor of Education degree in Music Education from Teachers College, Columbia University, New York, where she worked with adult singers in community choruses. She is conductor of the Mariners Chorus at the Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, New York, and has directed a midshipman quartet in performance at the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel honoring John Cardinal O'Connor on his 80th birthday. Dr. Bell is a graduate of Lycoming College, Williamsport, Pennsylvania, and the Eastman School of Music, Rochester, New York. She is artistic director and conductor of the Annual Ocean Grove Youth Choir Festival.



Mark P. Thomas is in his 16th season as music director and conductor of the Schuylkill County Community Chorus and is the conductor and artistic director of the Choral Arts Society of the Upper Perkiomen Valley. He serves as an instructor of music at Penn State University and is director of the Upper Perkiomen High School Choir. Mr. Thomas earned his B.S. and M.S. degrees, summa cum laude, in vocal and instrumental music education, performance and production from West Chester and Kutztown Universities and continued graduate studies in choral and orchestral conducting at the Eastman School of Music in Rochester and at the University of the Arts in Philadelphia. Having received citations from the Pennsylvania House of Representatives and Senate, the Schuylkill County Board of Commissioners, the Office of the President of the United States and the Austrian and German governments, he was named "Citizen of the Year."



Len Filipowski began performing professionally on piano and organ at the age of seven. By age 12 he had performed at Avery Fisher Hall, Lincoln Center, to critical acclaim. He has been playing frequently in both the United States and Europe. Mr. Filipowski has performed in Yankee Stadium, the Trump Taj Mahal, The Regis Philbin Show and with Willie Nelson, receiving five Grammy awards. He became a conductor in 1983 and is presently the Director of Music at Butler (New Jersey) United Methodist Church. Mr. Filipowski is also a stunt man having appeared in a moving picture titled "Caged in Paradise" filmed at St. Thomas in the U.S. Virgin Islands. Recently he received the "Innovative Educator of the Year" award given by the Helen Hayes Performing Arts Center.



Thomas R. Berdos earned his Bachelor of Music in Music Education and his Master of Music in Music Performance degrees at the University of Lowell. As a pianist he won the university's 1981 Concerto Competition. Mr. Berdos has performed in Asia and South America as well as the United States. Last year he was featured on Japanese national television. Presently he serves as Director of Music Ministries at Hilltop Presbyterian Church in Mendham, New Jersey, leading both adult and children's vocal and handbell choirs. Mr. Berdos teaches piano at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Short Hills, New Jersey, and is on the faculty of the Pingry School and Bergen County Community College. He has presented concerts in Ocean Grove under the auspices of the gospel Music Ministries. He holds membership in the American Choral Directors Association.



Craig Courtney, a native of Indiana, now residing in Columbus, Ohio, began playing the piano at the age of three and the cello at eleven. He received both Bachelors and Masters Degrees in piano performance from the University of Cincinnati, studying piano under Raymond Dudley and chamber music under Walter Levin of the LaSalle Quartet. In Milan, Italy, Mr. Courtney studied piano with Ilonka Deckers, performed for the Associazione Musicale "Gustav Mahler" and worked as a vocal coach. He joined the music faculty of the famed Mozarteum in Salzburg, Austria, serving as piano teacher and accompanist. His sacred choral compositions drew the attention of John Ness Beck of Beckenhurst Press who appointed Mr. Courtney to assume his responsibilities as staff composer and editor. Mr. Courtney's published works include over one hundred sacred choral octavos, seven vocal collections and four extended works for choir and orchestra.



Judith Werner is the Associate Director of Music at the First Presbyterian church in Red Bank, New Jersey, a position she has held for twenty-five years. She is a graduate of Douglass College with a B.A. degree and earned a Masters Degree in Church Music from Westminster Choir College where she was an organ student of George Markey and Joan Lippincott. She directs five handbell choirs with the two senior high school groups having performed extensively in all parts of the United States as well as England, Wales, "Austria, Switzerland and Canada. They have appeared at the United Nations, the White House, in Zermatt for the president of Switzerland as well as on a special television program for CNN. Ms. Werner has taught several courses for the American Guild of English Handbell Ringers and at the International Symposium in Exeter, England.



Carl J. Nygard, Jr. is a resident of Berks County, Pennsylvania. Having graduated from West Chester University in 1969 with a degree in Music Education, he was granted that institution's first Master of Music in Composition degree in 1977. Possessing a special talent for choral and instrumental composition, Mr. Nygard has written more than one hundred sixty anthems which have been successfully published for use in worship and in concert. His sacred and secular music has been scored and arranged for many combinations of voices and instrumental accompaniment. He has worked as a music critic and as a music consultant for the Macmillan Book Co. Mr. Nygard is director of secondary vocal and classroom music for the Fleetwood Area School District near Reading, Pa. He is frequently and adjudicator and conductor for major choral festivals.



Evelyn Swensson is celebrating her 50th year in the ministry of music having served Aldersgate United Methodist church in Wilmington, Delaware, for 32 years. In April she conducted an 80 voice choir on a concert tour of England performing at Coventry, Salisbury, York Minster and Wesley's Chapel in London. Mrs. Swensson holds a B.A. degree in piano and voice from Hollins College, a Master of Music degree from West Chester University and is an accredited choirmaster in the American Guild of Organists. as director of Opera Delaware's Family theater, she has composed and conducted ten musicals which were performed in 30 states last year. Awards include the "Distinguished Alumna" from West Chester University and five composer awards from the National League of American Pen Women.



Charles Harris is Director of Musical Ministries at the First Presbyterian Church in Red Bank, New Jersey, where he is senior organist and conductor of eight singing choirs and eight handbell choirs. He produces and conducts the Tower Hill Concert Series performing major choral works with orchestra. He also directs a summer music camp for children. Mr. Harris is a featured organ recitalist both in the United State and abroad and served as guest organist with Billy Graham Evangelistic Association. A graduate of the School of Music at the University of North Texas, he earned his Masters Degree at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey. He served the Tyler Street United Methodist Church in Dallas, Texas prior to coming to New Jersey.



Lewis A. Daniels was Minister of Music for several large churches in the Philadelphia area and in northern New Jersey. He has been Director of Music for the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association since 1966. Among his responsibilities are selecting, rehearsing and conducting choral music for worship services in the Great Auditorium, leading singing for Camp Meeting, producing the Annual Choir Festival and conducting oratorios with orchestra. Mr. Daniels teaches choral workshops and leads congregational singing at church celebrations. Studies were at Drexel University, Philadelphia Musical Academy and Philadelphia College of the Bible. He is now observing his 50th year in the ministry of music.
