Dr. Cindy Bell, an Ocean Grove native, is Assistant Professor of Music Education at the Aaron Copland School of Music at Queens College, City University of New York where she teaches both graduate and undergraduate students and conducts the Queens College Chorus. She is also director of the Mariners Chorus at the US Merchant Marine Academy in Kings Point, NY, which performs for civic and military functions in the New York area. Dr. Bell is a graduate of Lycoming College (PA), earned the Master of Music in Choral Conducting from the Eastman School of Music (NY), and the Doctor of Education degree in Music Education from Teachers College, Columbia University (NY). She has taught high school choral music, conducted church choirs and is director of the Annual Ocean Grove Youth Choir Festival held in June.



Thomas Berdos earned his Bachelor of Music in Music Education and his Master of Music in Music Performance at the University of Lowell. As a pianist he won the university's 1981 Concerto Competition. Mr. Berdos has performed in Asia, South America, and a number of locations in the United States. He was featured as a piano instructor in a news report on Japanese national television in 2000. Mr. Berdos serves as Director of Music Ministries at Hilltop Presbyterian Church in Mendham, NJ, where he directs the Sanctuary Choir, Sanctuary Ringers, and children's vocal and handbell choirs. He also teaches piano at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Short Hills, NJ, and is on the music faculty of the Pingry School. Mr. Berdos has represented several concert programs at Ocean Grove under the auspices of the Gospel Music Ministries, and was a guest conductor at the 1999 and 2001 Ocean Grove Choir Festivals.



Dr. James Cochran is the founder and director of the 120 voice Philharmonic Center Chorale in association with The Naples Philharmonic Orchestra in Florida where he has been a guest conductor. He is also the resident organist of the orchestra and Director of Music at Vanderbilt Presbyterian Church. An accomplished recitalist, Dr. Cochran has performed extensively in Canada, Great Britain and Mexico as well as the United States. He accompanied renowned soloists and in collaboration with other instrumentalists recorded a compact disc. Susquehanna University, Selinsgrove, Pa., awarded him the Bachelor of Music degree, while his Master and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees were earned at the Eastman School of Music, Rochester, N.Y. Dr. Cochran is a member of the American Guild of Organists, the American Choral Directors Association, Chorus America and the Guild of Temple Musicians and is listed in the international Who's Who in Music.



Davis P. Giersch - Dr. Giersch, a native of the Delaware Valley, resides in Lansdale, Pennsylvania. He holds degrees from Penn State University and Temple University and has taught at both institutions. Presently Dr. Giersch is on the faculty of North Penn High School where he is responsible for all choral ensembles including the select concert choir, the chorus, the Madrigal Singers, and the vocal jazz Ambassadors. These ensembles regularly perform at local, state and national workshops and festivals. He teaches music theory and a music scholars' course. Famous for his skill as a composer, his music has been premiered by the North Penn Symphony Orchestra as well as churches and instrumental and vocal ensembles.



Charles Harris is Director of Musical Ministries at the First Presbyterian Church in Red Bank, New Jersey, where he is senior organist and conductor of eight singing choirs and eight handbell choirs. He produces and conducts the Tower Hill Concert Series performing major choral works with orchestra. He also directs a summer music camp for children. Mr. Harris is a featured organ recitalist both in the United State and abroad and served as guest organist with Billy Graham Evangelistic Association. A graduate of the School of Music at the University of North Texas, he earned his Masters Degree at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, New Jersey. He served the Tyler Street United Methodist Church in Dallas, Texas prior to coming to New Jersey.



Dr. Charles Hausmann - is the director of the Houston Symphony Chorus and professor of music at the University of Houston where he conducts the major choral organizations, teaches conducting and supervises the master's and doctoral programs in choral conducting. He also directs St. Philip Presbyterian Church Choir. He holds degrees from Westminster Choir College, Trenton State College and the Conservatory of Music at the University of Missouri-Kansas City. Hausmann has served on the faculties of Western Kentucky University and Westminster Choir College. Choirs under his direction have received acclaim through appearances at major musical conventions and festivals in the United States and Europe.



Carl J. Nygard, Jr. is a resident of Berks County, Pennsylvania. Having graduated from West Chester University in 1969 with a degree in Music Education, he was granted that institution's first Master of Music in Composition degree in 1977. Possessing a special talent for choral and instrumental composition, Mr. Nygard has written more than one hundred sixty anthems which have been successfully published for use in worship and in concert. His sacred and secular music has been scored and arranged for many combinations of voices and instrumental accompaniment. He has worked as a music critic and as a music consultant for the Macmillan Book Co. Mr. Nygard is director of secondary vocal and classroom music for the Fleetwood Area School District near Reading, Pa. He is frequently an adjudicator and conductor for major choral festivals.



JoAnne Teubner-Prussak - earned her B.S. degree at Mannes College of Music in New York City. She studied piano with Joseph Raieff, a pupil of Arthur Schnabel, and organ with Edgar Hilliar, a pupil of E. Power Biggs. At the Juilliard School of Music she developed conducting skills with Abraham Kaplan. Ms. Teubner-Prussak conducted the Pontifical Choir of Paterson, N.J., in a series of cathedral concerts and performed on radio and television. Appearing as a concert pianist and organist in the U.S. and Germany she received great acclaim. She is Director of Music at the United Methodist Church of Summit, N.J., and conductor of the Carlstadt Mixed Chorus, Plainfield Gesang und Turn Verein, Volkschor Harmonie and the mass chorus at the Garden State Arts Center.



Clayton White earned undergraduate and graduate degrees in music education and composition from Temple University. He completed postgraduate studies in voice and conducting at Westminster Choir College. Retired as Department Chair and Professor of Music at Community College of Philadelphia, he now works as an independent composer, arranger, and music publisher. Also, he continues as Music Director of the Clayton White Singers. An accomplished composer, choral arranger, vocal coach and accompanist, his credits include recordings, radio, television, and film.



Lewis A. Daniels was Minister of Music for several large churches in the Philadelphia area and in northern New Jersey. He has been Director of Music for the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association since 1966. Among his responsibilities are selecting, rehearsing and conducting choral music for worship services in the Great Auditorium, leading singing for Camp Meeting, producing the Annual Choir Festival and conducting oratorios. Mr. Daniels teaches choral workshops and leads congregational singing at church celebrations. Studies were at Drexel University, Philadelphia Musical Academy and Philadelphia College of the Bible. He is now observing his 54th year in the ministry of music.
