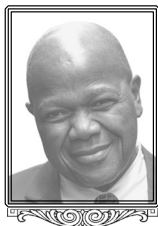


Cindy L. Bell is a fifth generation Ocean Grover, growing up in this seaside resort participating in the summer youth dramatic programs, youth choir and swim team. Now as Professor of Music at Hofstra University, she directs the undergraduate and graduate programs in music education, and conducts the University Choir. She is a graduate of Lycoming College [PA], the Eastman School of Music [NY] and Teachers College of Columbia University, where she earned the Ed.D. in Music Education. Dr. Bell has presented workshops for state, divisional and national music education and choral conferences, such as NYSSMA, NafME, ISME and ACDA, adjudicates choirs for the Long Island Music Festival and guest conducts choirs of all ages. She is keenly interested in preserving the unique history of Ocean Grove for the next generation, and contributes her time and talents to the Historical Society, researching the musical programs of Ocean Grove, and most recently facilitating the restoration of the beautiful fountain in Founders Park.



Fueled by a passion to share new music that engages conductors, ensembles, and audiences alike, **Michael John Trotta** is fast becoming one of the most exciting and prominent new composers of choral music. Drawing on his experience as a conductor and clinician, he brings artistry and excellence within reach for thousands of musicians each year.

From Carnegie Hall to classrooms all over the world, Trotta's unique blend of engaging and artistic music creates opportunities to experience new music and empowers individuals to realize their artistic potential. His engaging style fuses tradition and innovation to create moments of beauty that "effectively carry out a dialogue between the [music] and the modern listener." (*Choral Journal*)



Everett McCorvey is a native of Montgomery, Alabama, and received his degrees from the University of Alabama. Dr. McCorvey holds the rank of Professor of Voice and the OperaLex Endowed Chair in Opera Studies and is the Director and Executive Producer of UK Opera Theatre. Dr. McCorvey established, directs, and tours nationally and internationally with the American Spiritual Ensemble and is in his 6th season as the Artistic Director of the National Chorale, a professional choral organization that presents an annual choral-orchestral series at Lincoln Center in New York. He served as the executive producer for the opening and closing ceremonies of the 2010 Alltech FEI World Equestrian Games, the largest equestrian event in the history of the United States. Dr. McCorvey was recently chosen as the 2020 recipient for the Southeastern Athletic Conference Faculty Achievement Award for the University of Kentucky and was the 2018 recipient of the University of Kentucky Libraries Medallion for Intellectual Achievement Award, one of the highest awards presented by the University. The award promotes education and creative thought. He is also vice-chair of the Kentucky Arts Council for the Commonwealth of Kentucky.



Fiona Smith Sutherland is a career Church Musician, who has served many large churches and parishes in Connecticut, New York, and now back in her home state of New Jersey at Tower Hill Church in Red Bank as Director of Traditional Music and Organist. As a choral conductor, organist, accompanist, and handbell clinician, she is sought after as a guest conductor and artist. Fiona earned both her Undergraduate and Graduate degrees at Westminster Choir College in Princeton, and is currently in the process of earning her doctorate. As a Sacred Musician, she has taken choirs on international tours, conducted and played at large venues including St Thomas Fifth Avenue, and has had the opportunity to play for President Obama. The pandemic has brought on a whole level of technological expertise in audio engineering, which she embraced and mastered. Fiona also is the accompanist for two local choral societies, the Shrewsbury Chorale and the Lakeside Choraliers. This is her first time conducting here at the Great Auditorium and the Ocean Grove Choir Festival and she is honored to be part of this brilliant musical tradition!



Marina Alexander conducts the Arcadian Chorale (NJ) and Richmond Choral Society (NYC). Noted for her scholarship and innovative programming, she has resurrected rarely heard masterpieces and presented US or NY area premieres of many works, including her own compositions. Ms. Alexander has performed at Carnegie Hall on several occasions, conducting *Te Deum* settings by Otto Olsson and Antonin Dvorak, and appeared as Guest Conductor with many NY area orchestras leading major works, including the Verdi *Requiem*, Mozart "Great" *Mass in C minor*, and Beethoven *Symphony #9*. She is Adjunct Associate Professor at the College of Staten Island-CUNY, teaching Conducting, Vocal Performance, and Music History, and often appears as a clinician at choral workshops and music festivals. Ms. Alexander is also vice-president of the NJ Choral Consortium.



A life-long lover of music, **Rider R. Foster** has performed as a chorister, conductor, and soloist throughout his life. A former student of Thomas Faracco at Westminster Choir College, he was a member of internationally recognized Westminster Choir under the direction of Joe Miller, and of the Emmy Nominated Williamson Voices under the direction of James Jordan. He has also participated in two recordings under the auspices of Westminster Choir College's ensembles, along with myriad performances, most notably with NYC Opera, and with similarly prominent conductors and orchestras. He is the founding director and conductor of Clarum Sonum, which is an entirely volunteer choir dedicated to the performance of new music and collaboratively enriching local music programs both sacred and secular. He is also chorus master for Light Opera of New Jersey.

R. Kevin Boesiger received a Bachelor of Music Education from Nebraska Wesleyan University and a Masters of Music in Music Composition from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. He is the Arts and Education Director at the Kroc Center in Omaha, Nebraska. Boesiger previously was the Creative Arts Pastor at Christ Community Church in Beatrice where he has served from 1990-2017. He also served as the Choral conductor for Southeast Community College in Beatrice where he directed the choir and served as the musical director for their stage productions for 12 years. He has studied with Mark Hayes, Dr. Randall Snyder, Tyler White and Boyd Bacon. Kevin performs and conducts on a regular basis for many community events, including the Beatrice Regional Orchestra, and enjoys his time as a husband and father of four. He has been married to Tami since 1986.



Dr. Jason C. Tramm is celebrating his fifteenth season as Director of Music Ministries with the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association. Sacred music has been central to his career from a very early age, beginning at age five as a boy soprano soloist at St. Thomas Lutheran Church in West Nyack, NY. His work in the sacred, symphonic and operatic realms have received acclaim both nationally and internationally. Dr. Tramm currently serves as an Associate Professor and Director of Choral Activities at Seton Hall University (where he was named the 2017 University Faculty Teacher of the Year), Artistic Director of the MidAtlantic Artistic Productions, Music Director of the Taghkanic Chorale (Yorktown Heights, NY), Music Director of the Axelrod Contemporary Ballet Ensemble, Principal Guest Conductor of the Long Island Concert Orchestra. Dr. Tramm has conducted in many prestigious venues including Carnegie Hall, Merkin Hall, NJPAC and David Geffen Hall. He holds degrees from the Crane School (SUNY Potsdam), the Hartt School (University of Hartford) and a Doctoral of Musical Arts from Mason Gross (Rutgers University), where he was the recipient of the prestigious Presidential Fellowship. A frequent guest conductor, Dr. Tramm has led symphonic and operatic performances in Italy, Romania, Albania, Hungary and throughout the United States. He also is the host/creator of the *Music Matters with Jason Tramm* podcast, which explores musical innovation and artistic self-discoveries made during the Covid-19 era made by distinguished artists in a variety of musical genres. Music Matters can be heard on YouTube, Spotify, Google and Apple Podcasts and on the WMCA Radio in NYC from 11:30-Noon on Saturdays. The Tramm family is proud to call Ocean Grove their musical and spiritual home during the summer months.
