# Conductors



**Cindy L. Bell** is a fifth generation Ocean Grover, growing up in this seaside resort participating in the summer youth dramatic programs, youth choir and swim team. Now as Professor of Music at Hofstra University, she directs the undergraduate and graduate programs in music education, and conducts the University Choir. She is a graduate of Lycoming College [PA], the Eastman School of Music [NY] and Teachers College of Columbia University, where she earned the Ed.D. in Music Education. Dr. Bell has presented workshops for state, divisional and national music education and choral conferences, such as NYSSMA, NAFME, ISME and ACDA, adjudicates choirs for the Long Island Music Festival and guest conducts choirs of all ages. She is keenly interested in preserving the unique history of Ocean Grove for the next generation, and contributes her time and talents to the Historical Society, researching the musical programs of Ocean Grove, and most recently facilitating the restoration of the beautiful fountain in Founders Park.



**J. Donald Dumpson, Ph.D.**, is the minister of music and arts at the Arch Street Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia, PA, founder of the Philadelphia Heritage Chorale, the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra Community Chorus (NJSOCC) and the Westminster Choir College Jubilee Singers. He has taught at Cheyney University and the Philadelphia High School for the Creative and Performing Arts.

Dr. Dumpson debuted at Carnegie Hall in 2001 with the Westminster Choir College Jubilee Singers performing Gershwin's "Porgy and Bess" under the baton of the late maestro Skitch Henderson. He also prepared choruses for Maestros Willian Curry, Leslie Dunner, Charles Dutoit, Zdenek Macal, Bobby McFerrin, Yannick Nézet-Séguin, Julius Rudel, Andre Raphael Smith, Jason Tramn and Julius P. Williams.



**Preston Dibble** has served as Organist and Director of Music for Our Lady of Sorrows since August, 2019 and as the Diocesan Director of Music for the Roman Catholic Diocese of Paterson, NJ since 2013.

Preston is a graduate of Westminster College, New Wilmington and of Duquesne University, Pittsburgh. At Westminster, he earned a Bachelor of Music degree, majoring in Music Education and at Duquesne, the Master of Music degree, majoring in Sacred Music and Organ.

Preston is also very active within the professional associations for Church Musicians. In the American Guild of Organists, he serves as a member of the National Taskforce on Denominational Associations, Chair of the National Committee on Marketing from 2012-2019. A member of the National Pastoral Musicians, Preston serves nationally as Chair of the new Forum for Programming and Certification and on the NPM National Council; locally as the Paterson NPM Chapter Director.



**Thomas Berdos** is presently on the music faculty of The Pingry School, a private K-12 school in Short Hills and Martinsville, NJ. At The Pingry School he teaches grades four to six in the areas of General Music, Chorus, and Instrumental Music. In addition to teaching at The Pingry School, Mr. Berdos serves as Director of Music Ministries at Fanwood Presbyterian Church in Fanwood, NJ. He conducts the Sanctuary Choir, Sanctuary Ringers, and other ensembles. He organized and produces the Fanwood Choir Festival, a community outreach held at the church.

Mr. Berdos earned the B.M. in Music Education, summa cum laude, and the M.M. in Music Performance from the University of Lowell (now the University of Massachusetts Lowell). He has performed in the United States and abroad, and has taught music to all ages and levels for over thirty years.



**Malena Towers** was accepted recently into two Doctoral of Music programs at the University of West Virginia and Liberty University, Virginia, including an adjunct teaching position of Voice. Malena serves as a Music Director at St. Mary's Church in Middletown, New Jersey. Malena is a Cuban American Soprano and graduated with a Bachelor and Master's degrees in Music in Voice Performance, and Conducting, from The Institute of Arts in Havana, Cuba, and from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary (SWBTS) in Texas. She became the first professional singer and piano player of Hebrew and International music in her country of birth, Cuba. She conducted the Children's Choir and Youth Choir from the National Opera Center in Cuba. She conducted the adult's Choir of the Symphonic Orchestra from Guiana, Venezuela. She won the First Place at the Choir festival of Margarita Islands, 2012 with her Children's Choir from the Loeffling College, in Guiana, Venezuela. She is the first Cuban to graduate with honors from SWBTS in 2016.



**Beverly Vaughn**, Professor of Music and Vocal/Choral Program Coordinator at Stockton University, is a native of Columbus, Ohio and a graduate of La Sierra University in Riverside, California. Following graduation from La Sierra University, she completed both her Master of Music degree and Doctor of Music degree — both in voice performance — at The Ohio State University.

Among her duties as Stockton's Vocal/Choral Program Coordinator, she conducts the University Chorus, The Stockton Select Chorale, The Stockton Oratorio Society and the Vocal Jazz Ensemble. Under her direction, the choral organization have traveled to Europe and given full-length performances of operatic masterworks as well as evenings of music devoted to genres such as the music of Broadway, the operettas of Gilbert & Sullivan, vocal jazz holiday music and African American Spirituals. Vaughn has conducted choirs throughout the world in venues from the Forbidden City in Beijing to churches in Florence, Italy and Valencia, Spain to recital halls in Zomba, Malawi.

Residing in the Philadelphia suburbs, Mr. Ross Boerner is a choral conductor, church music director, vocalist and pianist. He has been an Ocean Grove Choir Festival chorister for almost 30 years and is honored to stand on the podium tonight. Mr. Boerner holds a BA in Music from Eastern University in St. Davids, PA and is currently perusing a Master's degree in choral conducting at the University of Texas at El Paso.

Mr. Boerner has performed in multiple concerts in New York's Carnegie Hall, including the premiere of David Fanshaw's *African Sanctus*. Around the Philadelphia region he has been a guest choral and orchestral conductor at several churches for Christmas concerts and other special programs. Overseas, he has performed in Westminster Abbey, Arundel Cathedral, and Notre Dame Cathedral.

In addition to owning and operating his own piano lesson studio, Mr. Boerner currently serves as the Director of Music Ministries at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in King of Prussia, PA and is the Artistic Director and Conductor of The Norristown Chorale.



**Dr. Jason C. Tramm** is celebrating his sixteenth season as Director of Music Ministries with the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association. Sacred music has been central to his career from a very early age, beginning at age five as a boy soprano soloist at St. Thomas Lutheran Church in West Nyack, NY. His work in the sacred, symphonic and operatic realms have received acclaim both nationally and internationally. Dr. Tramm currently serves as an Associate Professor and Director of Choral Activities at Seton Hall University (where he was named the 2017 University Faculty Teacher of the Year), Executive Director of the Light Opera of New Jersey, Artistic Director of the MidAtlantic Artistic Productions, Music Director of the Taghkanic Chorale (Yorktown Heights, NY), and Principal Guest Conductor of the Long Island Concert Orchestra. Dr. Tramm has conducted in many prestigious venues including Carnegie Hall, Merkin Hall, NJPAC and David Geffen Hall. He holds degrees from the Crane School (SUNY Potsdam), the Hartt School (University of Hartford) and a Doctoral of Musical Arts from Mason Gross (Rutgers University), where he was the recipient of the prestigious Presidential Fellowship. A frequent guest conductor, Dr. Tramm has led symphonic and operatic performances in Italy, Romania, Albania, Hungary and throughout the United States. Upcoming international guest conducting engagements for the 22–23 season include performances in Italy (Rome and Florence), Austria (Salzburg and Klagenfurt) and Hungary (Budapest). He also is the host/creator of the *Music Matters with Jason Tramm* podcast on YouTube, which explores musical innovation and self-discovery as seen through the eyes of distinguished artists. The Tramm family is proud to call Ocean Grove their musical and spiritual home during the summer months.
