Sacred Music Across the Ages: PROGRAM NOTES

Tonight's program celebrates the diversity of sacred music by great composers drawn from larger works that were written from 1741 to the present. We have all been blessed by the power of God's word through the centuries as interpreted by these masters of the musical craft.

We begin with the *Kyrie* from Beethoven's great *Mass in C Major*. This piece was written in 1807 and contained many of the musical characteristics of Beethoven's heroic period: accents in unusual places, surprising harmonic choices and the deeper rhetorical connection between music and text. This work was even performed during the famed concert in 1808 that saw the premiere of the Symphony No. 5 and 6.

The next work on the program features the music of Norwegian born composer, Ola Gjeilo (b. 1978), who now resides in New York City. This setting of the *Gloria* is drawn from his 2008 *Sunrise Mass*, a work which combines sacred minimalism with the composer's love for cinematic music. Gjeilo's work has been universally acclaimed and he has established himself as one of the most performed and published living composers in the world.

The *Offertorio (Requiem, 1874)* and *Sanctus/Benedictus (Saint Cecelia Mass, 1855)* were written by two of the most famous composers of opera, Giuseppe Verdi and Charles Gounod. Verdi's *Requiem* is one of the most performed

choral/orchestral masterworks (alongside Handel's *Messiah* and Mozart's *Requiem*) and Gounod's *Saint Cecelia Mass* marked the first work of a young composer who was destined to write some of the most important operatic works in the repertoire. In putting this program together, I really enjoyed exploring the contract that these works added to the program.

I am delighted to welcome renowned conductor/composer Tim Sharp to the Great Auditorium for the first time on tonight's program. Dr. Sharp will be conducting two movements of his *Come Away to the Skies: A High, Lonesome Mass*, which has received hundreds of performances both in the United States and abroad (the *Agnus Dei* was performed on last year's Ocean Grove Choir Festival). This piece was written in collaboration with Wes Ramsey, also a noted composer/arranger. This unique work explored the mass setting through the musical language of Bluegrass, complete with banjo and authentic instrumentation.

Tonight's program concludes with the final movement of Handel's *Messiah*, which has provided power and majesty to both singers and audience since its premiere in 1741 in Dublin, Ireland.

Thank you for joining us for tonight's performance of great music in the magnificent Great Auditorium.
