Conductors



Cindy L. Bell is a fifth generation Ocean Grover, growing up in this seaside resort participating in the summer youth dramatic programs, youth choir and swim team. This is her 35th Ocean Grove Choir Festival as a guest conductor. In May, she retired from full-time teaching as Professor of Music at Hofstra University on Long Island, where she directed the music education program and conducted the 75-voice University Choir. During her 25-year career in higher education, Dr. Bell focused on teaching training and mentored some 500 student teachers and graduate students in the New York area schools. She has published research on student teacher training, critical thinking, community music and choral singing, and has guest conducted festival choruses. She is keenly interested in preserving the unique history of Ocean Grove for the next generation, and contributes her time and talents to the Historical Society, researching the musical programs of Ocean Grove, and most recently facilitating the restoration of the beautiful fountain in Founders Park.



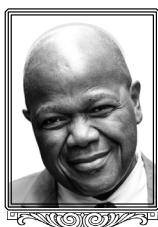
Rider Foster, a life-long lover of music, has performed as a chorister, conductor, and soloist throughout his life. A former student of Thomas Faracco at Westminster Choir College, he was a member of internationally-recognized Westminster Choir under the direction of Joe Miller, and of the Emmy-Nominated Williamson Voices under the direction of James Jordan. He has also participated in two recordings under the auspices of Westminster Choir College's ensembles, along with myriad performances, most notably with NYC Opera, and with similarly prominent conductors and orchestras. He is the founding director and conductor of Clarum Sonum, which is an entirely volunteer choir dedicated to the performance of new music and collaboratively enriching local music programs both sacred and secular. He is also chorus master for Light Opera of New Jersey.



Dr. Thomas Juneau is the Director of Choral Activities at Wagner College, New York City, Music Director of the Summit Chorale, Minister of Music at Saint Joseph's Church in Carteret, NJ, and teacher of general music at Saint Joseph's school. An accomplished conductor and composer, Dr. Juneau has conducted significant works such as Handel's *Dixit Dominus*, Beethoven's Mass in C, and a variety of Requiems, and composes choral pieces published by notable music companies. His album, *Visions Eternal*, was released in 2015 under the Ravello label. Passionate about education, he actively mentors budding conductors, offering guidance and opportunities to aid their professional growth. His latest major choral and orchestral piece, *Missa Jubilate Deo*, now the *Missa Pacem in Terra*, was premiered in 2018. Dr. Juneau is in high demand for commissions and his compositions have been performed around the world.



Renowned American conductor **Anthony LaGruth** is celebrated for his innovative approach to classical music and his knack for audience engagement. Acclaimed for his subtlety, refined style, dramatic sensitivity, and flexible tempos, LaGruth has collaborated with esteemed composers like Hans Werner Henze, John Corigliano, and Pulitzer Prize winner Karel Husa, along with a variety of soloists and popular performers. He currently serves as Music Director and Conductor of Orchestra 201, the Livingston Symphony Orchestra, and the North Shore Music Festival, and is also the Associate Conductor of the North Shore Symphony. His past roles include a 20-year tenure as Artistic Director and Conductor of the Garden State Philharmonic, and six seasons as the Music Director of the Lyric Opera of San Antonio. LaGruth also contributes as a board member for the Conductors Guild.



Dr. Everett McCorvey, a noted tenor and Doctor of Musical Arts, boasts a multifaceted career, demonstrating expertise as a musical director, stage director, producer, orchestra conductor, teacher, and administrator. With performances at venues from the Metropolitan Opera to the Kennedy Center, McCorvey's impact on the performing arts is global. His recent work includes conducting the world premiere of Stella Sung's Opera *The Secret River* and Dvořák's *Symphony #9* in Prague's Smetana Hall. Upcoming concerts include Musikverein Golden Hall in Vienna, conducting the Boshualave Martinu Philharmonic and in Haydn Hall Vienna with the Euro sinfonietta as well as an upcoming World Premiere with the Santa Fe Opera's Opera for All Voices in performances of *This Little Light Of Mine* by Chandler Carter. His prestigious recognition includes several teaching and service awards, highlighting his lasting contributions to the arts community.



Dr. Mark A. Miller, a passionate advocate for the transformative power of music, serves as an Assistant Professor of Church Music at Drew Theological School, a Lecturer in the Practice of Sacred Music at Yale University, and the Minister of Music at Christ Church in New Jersey. Having led music for United Methodists and others nationwide since 1999, including the 2008 General Conference, Mark's choral anthems and hymns are published widely, including in "Worship & Song" and "The Faith We Sing". Mark is an alumnus of Yale University and Juilliard, with a BA in Music and a Master's in Organ Performance respectively. He is the grandson, son, brother, uncle, and cousin to United Methodist clergy and he was a lay delegate to the 2000, 2004 and 2012 General Conferences.

Conductors



Fiona Smith Sutherland is a long-time sacred musician and choral conductor, having served many large churches and parishes in Connecticut, New York, and now back in her home state of New Jersey at Tower Hill Church in Red Bank as Director of Traditional Music and Organist. As a choral conductor, organist, accompanist, and handbell clinician, she is sought after as a guest conductor and artist. Fiona earned both her Undergraduate and Graduate degrees at Westminster Choir College in Princeton. As a church musician, she has taken choirs on international tours, conducted and played at large venues including St Thomas Fifth Avenue, and has had the privilege to play for President Obama. Fiona is the Musical Director of the Shrewsbury Chorale, which she continues to increase in size and quality. Under her leadership, the Chorale sings an eclectic set of repertoire, featuring new music by contemporary, living choral composers. Also, she is the accompanist for a NJ choral society, the Lakeside Choraliers. This is her second time conducting here at the Great Auditorium at the Ocean Grove Choir Festival and she is honored to be part of this brilliant and blessed musical tradition.



Dr. Jason C. Tramm is celebrating his seventeenth season as Director of Music Ministries with the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association. Sacred music has been central to his career from a very early age, beginning at age five as a boy soprano soloist at St. Thomas Lutheran Church in West Nyack, NY. His work in the sacred, symphonic and operatic realms have received acclaim both nationally and internationally. Dr. Tramm currently serves as an Associate Professor and Director of Choral Activities at Seton Hall University (where he was named the 2017 University Faculty Teacher of the Year), Executive Director of the Light Opera of New Jersey, Artistic Director of the MidAtlantic Artistic Productions, Music Director of the Taghkanic Chorale (Yorktown Heights, NY), the newly announced Music Director of the Putnam Chorale and Principal Guest Conductor of the Long Island Concert Orchestra. Dr. Tramm has conducted in many prestigious venues including Carnegie Hall, Merkin Hall, NJPAC and David Geffen Hall. He holds degrees from the Crane School (SUNY Potsdam), the Hartt School (University of Hartford) and a Doctoral of Musical Arts from Mason Gross (Rutgers University), where he was the recipient of the prestigious Presidential Fellowship. A frequent guest conductor, Dr. Tramm has led symphonic and operatic performances in Italy, Romania, Albania, Hungary and throughout the United States. Upcoming international guest conducting engagements for the 23–24 season include performances in Greece, Poland, Italy and throughout the United States. He also is the host/creator of the Music Matters with Jason Tramm podcast on YouTube, which explores musical innovation and self-discovery as seen through the eyes of distinguished artists. The Tramm family is proud to call Ocean Grove their musical and spiritual home during the summer months.
