DIRECTORS



Arthur W. Crouthamel, founder and musical director of the Abington Oratorio Choir, is also music director and organist at the Heidelberg United Church of Christ in Hatfield, PA. He studied organ with the late Dr. Harry C. Banks at Girard College and the late Dr. Keith Chapman, former head organist at Wanamaker's in Philadelphia. He received his master's degree in music conducting with Dr. Elaine Brown of The Singing City Choir. He has retired from public school education but is active in composition and conducting.



Elizabeth Dietz, in her fifth year as Director of the Teen Choral Dramatics and Youth Choir programs for the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association, completed her undergraduate and graduate studies in music at West Chester University. She has taught vocal and general music in the Boyertown area School District for 22 years where she directed many choruses and musicals. Miss Dietz also coached girls Lacrosse and is a member of the Student Assistance Program Team dealing with teen age problems. She has been selected for Who's Who Among American Teachers.



Cindy L. Bell is a fifth generation native of this famous Christian seaside resort, Ocean Grove, New Jersey. She is choral director at Sayville High School on Long Island, and the Sayville UMC. Miss Bell is a graduate of Lycoming College, PA and earned the Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting at the Eastman School of Music, Rochester NY, where she was a student of Donald Neuen. She has worked in advertising and sales for Shawnee Press, and acted as clinician for choral workshops. Presently, Miss Bell is a member of the Long Island Symphonic Choral Ass'n., directed by Gregg Smith, and has sung with Robert Shaw and John Rutter.



Robert Davis is Conductor and Music Director of The American Chamber Orchestra. In addition to his extensive orchestral performance experience, he has been Music Director of 12 professional, college, private school, and church choirs. Mr. Davis is a frequent university and conference speaker, an educational consultant, and book editor.



Ralph Winters, having studied with several prominent musicians, has had a long career as a vocalist, song leader and choral director. He was a licensed local preacher as well as the choir director of the Epworth United Methodist Church in Paterson, NJ. Mr. Winters is retired from the Bloomfield, NJ Board of Education and now conducts the choir at Faith Reformed Church in Midland Park.



Clayton White earned undergraduate and graduate degrees in music and music education from the College of Music at Temple University. He completed post-graduate work at Temple and Westminster Choir College. He serves as Associate Professor of Music at The Community College of Phila., Minister of Music of Zion Baptist Church in Philadelphia, Music Director and Conductor of his professional chorus, *The Clayton White Singers*, Chorus Master and Conductor for Opera Ebony and Opera North. Mr. White has performed in numerous recitals, concerts and operas. His credits also include recordings, radio and TV performances, and motion picture sound tracks.



Nancy Wertsch studied piano at the University in Madison and voice at the famed Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, PA. Her compositions have been performed by the Gregg Smith singers, the Treble Singers and the Dale Warland Singers. She has received commissions from the Riverside Church, Meet the Composer, and Holy Trinity Lutheran Church whose Bach Orchestra premiered her organ concerto. Ms. Wertsch's music has been performed at the White House, the annual Martin Luther King Day celebration in Atlanta and in churches throughout the United States.



John L. Wilson is Director of Music and Organist at the 2,000 member Haddonfield United Methodist Church, where he conducts ten choirs, including a 125 voice Oratorio Choir and professional orchestra. Mr. Wilson graduated from Westminster College, PA and the School of Sacred Music at Union Seminary in New York City and has completed additional graduate study at Westminster Choir College in Princeton. Mr. Wilson also holds the Choirmaster and Associate certifications from the American Guild of Organists having been state chairman. He is certified as a Director of Music by the United Methodist Church.



William R. Shoppell, Jr. retired last month as Music Director and Conductor of the Monmouth Civic Chorus, completing a thirty year association. He has been honored with the title "Conductor Emeritus". Having graduated from Lebanon Valley College and Columbia University, Mr. Shoppell is Chairman of the Music Department of the Freehold Regional School District, and is Director of Music at the Point Pleasant Presbyterian Church.



Lewis A. Daniels is responsible for producing this Choir Festival, the twenty-sixth since he became Director of Music for the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association, succeeding the founder of the festival, Dr. Walter D. Eddowes. In addition to leading the Ocean Grove Auditorium Choir in anthems for worship services, he is preparing the choir to perform Rossini's *Stabat Mater* with orchestra and organ on August 25.

Rossini's 'Stabat Mater'
