Conductors



Dr. Cindy L. Bell is Associate Professor of Music Education at Hofstra University in Hempstead, NY, where she directs the 100-voice University Choir, teaches graduate and undergraduate classes, and coordinates the music education program. A specialist in choral music education and community choirs, Dr. Bell presents workshops for state, divisional and national music education and choral conferences, such as the NAfME 2014 National In-Service Conference in Nashville. She adjudicates choirs for the Long Island Music Festival and guest conducts choirs of all ages, including the 2015 PMEA Region VI High School Chorus in Pennsylvania, and the 2016 Delaware All-State Women's Chorus. A fifth generation Ocean Grover, she is co-author with her father, local historian Ted Bell, the 2012 book *The Great Auditorium: Ocean Grove's Architectural Treasure*, and is continuing research on the various Camp Meeting musical programs in Ocean Grove over the last 144 years.



Thomas R. Berdos is Director of Music Ministries at Fanwood Presbyterian Church. He is also on the music faculty of the Pingry School. Mr. Berdos has taught on the faculties of Taylor University and Nyack College, as well as other colleges. An award-winning music educator, he has co-presented workshops on elementary music and physics at NJAIS conventions. Mr. Berdos has organized and conducted regional performances of Handel's *Messiah* for many years, has conducted at past Ocean Grove Choir Festivals, and is the founder and coordinator of the Fanwood Choir Festival. Mr. Berdos has performed in Asia, South America, and in the US with his organist wife, Deborah Berdos. He is also a published composer of music for piano, organ, and brass ensemble.



Dr. Mark A. Boyle Dr. Mark A. Boyle is Director of Choral Activities at Seton Hill University in Greensburg, PA. Originally from Connecticut, he attended Susquehanna University, majoring in Music Education with an emphasis on tuba and trombone. He spent 5 years in the United States Navy, during which time he conducted the Bluejackets Memorial Choir. In constant demand as a tenor, his recent appearances include *Elijah* with the Bach Choir of Bethlehem, *The Shepherd* in Stravinsky's *Oedipus Rex* at the National Seminar of the IMC, and *Messiah* at Coral Ridge Presbyterian Church in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida. He has also conducted the 800 voice choir at the Ocean Grove Choral Festival, the New Jersey Central Region Choir, and several county choirs throughout Pennsylvania. 2014-2015 engagements included the Wisconsin Middle School All State Choir, the PMEA District IV Choral Festival, the Mucho Macho Festival in Pittsburgh, and the Westmoreland County Chorus Festival. Boyle serves ACDA as the College and University Repertoire and Standards Chair for the State of Pennsylvania, the Men's Choir Repertoire and Standards Chair for the Eastern Division, and the 2016 Eastern Division Conference App Liaison. He received his MM in choral conducting from Ball State University and the DMA in Choral Conducting from the Mason Gross School of the Arts, the arts conservatory of Rutgers, the State University of New Jersey. Married to music educator and pianist, Jane Boyle, they reside in New Stanton with their two sons, Nathan and Patrick. Dr. Boyle is thrilled to be returning to Ocean Grove



Dr. Joseph Martin a native of North Carolina, earned his Bachelor of Music degree in Piano Performance at Furman University in Greenville, SC. and his Master of Music degree in Piano Performance at the University of Texas, Austin. Joseph taught for 5 years in the Piano Pedagogy Department of the University of Texas. While at Furman University, he was accompanist for choral director and composer Milburn Price, who inspired him to compose. Joseph has performed solo piano recitals and has been the featured artist with symphony orchestras in the United States and Mexico. As winner of the Nina Plant Wideman Competition, he performed with the Guadalajara Symphony Orchestra. His solo recital in Ex-convento del Carmen was broadcast nationally throughout the country. His first solo piano recording, *American Tapestry*, was nominated for a Dove Award. He has recorded for Yamaha's Disklavier series and has composed hundreds of commissioned works. Recognized throughout the United States for his many choral compositions, both sacred and secular, over 2,000 compositions are currently in print. His composition "*Pieta*" was honored with an award from the John Ness Beck Foundation. In 2008 he was inducted as a National Patron of the Delta Omicron International Music Fraternity. His major works include 50 choral cantatas and *Song of Wisdom*, a choral tone poem based on the best-selling children's book, *Old Turtle*. His work for young voices *Heartsongs* was premiered at Carnegie Hall. Joe is co-founder of a unique travel experience, "*Journeys With Joe*." This program connects musicians and singers with extraordinary tours throughout the world. His company, Martin Creative Services, has established conferences and seminars throughout the US and has developed innovative web based ventures Sanctuary Radio and Worship Songs Online. Joseph is Artist in Residence at Concordia University in Austin, Texas where he lives with his wife Sue, and his children, Jonathan and Aubrey.

Conductors



Michael Schmidt is the Vocal Music Teacher at Voorhees High School in Glen Gardner, NJ. He also serves as the Minister of Music at St. Paul Lutheran Church, in East Windsor, NJ. In addition to his teaching and church work, Mr. Schmidt is the President-Elect for the New Jersey American Choral Directors Association, and Audition Registration Chair for the New Jersey All-State Choirs. Mr. Schmidt's conducting credits include conducting the Westminster Conservatory Youth Chorale, Interim conductor for the Hunterdon Choral Union, and he is excited to add the 2015 CJMEA Region 2 Women's Choir. As a pianist and organist, Mr. Schmidt has played for multiple performances throughout New Jersey, Pennsylvania, and New York. In addition, Mr. Schmidt has lead reading sessions for NJACDA, and presented sessions for the College Music Society, NJACDA, and New York State Music Educators Association. Mr. Schmidt received a Bachelor of Music Education and a Master of Arts in Teaching from Westminster Choir College in 2008.



Dr. Jason C. Tramm who celebrates his 9th season as Director of Music Ministries at the Ocean Grove Camp Meeting Association, is recognized as one of the most dynamic young conductors on the podium today. He has been hailed by critics and audiences alike for his work in the sacred, operatic and symphonic realms. His 2008 broadcast of Verdi's Requiem, shot in the Great Auditorium was nominated for an Emmy Award and aired on NJN. He has also appeared on two National Public Radio broadcasts with organ virtuoso, Gordon Turk and large orchestra. Dr. Tramm also serves as the Director of Choral Activities at Seton Hall University, where he directs two choirs, conducts the University Orchestra, teaches voice and teaches classes in conducting and music education. Frequently engaged as a guest conductor, Dr. Tramm has led operatic and symphonic performances in six countries and the throughout the US. He also serves as Artistic Director of the MidAtlantic Opera Company with whom he will make his Carnegie Hall debut on October 17, 2015. Sacred music has always held a special place in his heart, beginning as a boy soprano soloist at age six at St. Thomas Lutheran Church in West Nyack, NY. Dr. Tramm and his four children are proud to call Ocean Grove home for the summer months.



Marcello Velame in his 17th year tenure at First Presbyterian Church in Manasquan, has conducted major choral and orchestral works, both in and outside the church. He has also prepared choral works such as Beethoven Mass in C for performances at Carnegie Hall, and conducted the Royal Symphony in Toronto, was awarded the Alexander McCurdy Organ Scholarship while getting his education degree at Westminster Choir College, and conducted the ALLEGRO! chorus in performances in several venues in New Jersey. Marcello is also a music teacher at Shark River Elementary School.
